**INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE  
VERMONT CLAIM FORM:**

**Failure to provide this documentation will result in the delay of processing your claim.**

**If you cannot locate any of the required documents, please contact the Unclaimed Property Division for assistance.**

**ALL CLAIMS EXCEPT FOR EXPRESS:**

To file a claim:

1. Complete the requested information on the claim form.
2. Include a copy of your current identification (e.g., Driver's License, Passport or Non-driver's ID).
3. If your name has changed, provide documentation of that (marriage certificate and/or divorce decree).
4. Provide evidence of the address listed on the web-site.
  - If you no longer have any evidence, include a statement to that effect and indicate what years you resided at the address/addresses.
5. Provide documentation of your Social Security number (e.g. Social Security Card, W-2, Tax Return, etc.).

**Deceased Owner**

6. In addition to the above, you must provide a copy of the certified death certificate and a copy of obituary notice.
7. If the amount is over \$5,000 and there is no estate open, or there was an estate and it is now closed, you **must** open or re-open the estate.

**Business**

8. Business card and ID of claimant.
9. Federal tax ID number.
10. Proof of authorization to claim funds on behalf of the business, on letterhead signed by an officer of the company.
11. Articles of dissolution if company is closed.

**EXPRESS CLAIMS:**

***Claims will be processed within five business days***

To file an express claim:

1. You must be the original owner.
2. **The amount must be \$200 or less.**
3. Complete the requested information on the claim form.
4. If you **still live at** the address listed on the web-site, sign the claim form in the presence of a notary and send it in.
  - OR - If you prefer not to use a notary, include a copy of your current photo ID with the completed, signed claim form and mail both to us.
  - - OR -
5. If you **no longer live at** the address listed on the web-site, provide evidence you once lived at that address, a copy of your current photo ID, and a signed claim form (no notary needed) and mail to us.
  - OR - If you prefer, sign the form in front of a notary (no ID needed), provide proof you once lived at that address, and mail all to the Unclaimed Property Division.
6. If your social security number has been provided to us by the holder, submit proof of your Social Security number

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Examples of former address include, but are not limited to: copy of an old ID, utility bill, tax form, bank statement.

**Notice: under Vermont law it is illegal to make a false claim to a State agency in the manner proscribed by 13 V.S.A. § 3016 (a).** The named claimant hereby certifies that this claim for property presumed unclaimed is valid and just, that all statements herein are true and correct, and that upon payment of this claim, said claimant will indemnify and hold harmless the State, its officers and employees, from any other valid claim to said property.
